Dr. Saqer AlKhalifa is a professor, scholar, and policy advisor whose career spans academia, government, diplomacy, and international sport governance. He holds a doctorate in Political Science from Claremont Graduate University, where his research focused on institutional trust, governance reform, and economic development, the empirical backbone of *The Trust Trap*.

Over two decades, Dr. AlKhalifa has served as a media attaché, youth reform architect, and senior advisor at Bahrain's Ministry of Education. He has designed and led reform programmes across education, sport governance, and youth development, from U.S. diplomatic missions to public sector transformation across the Gulf region.

He is a professor at the American University of Bahrain and a graduate of The Citadel, The Military College of South Carolina, an institution that shaped his discipline, leadership philosophy, and commitment to systems thinking. He has spoken at Harvard University (The Dewan) and at numerous international conferences on governance, trust, and institutional reform.

A public intellectual, Dr. AlKhalifa is also a 30-time IRONMAN triathlon finisher, a discipline he sees as a direct expression of the book's central thesis: that endurance is built through systems, not inspiration. He is a father of four and is based in Bahrain.
